I have requested assistance from the FBI field office in Kansas City, MO and my U.S. Senator Mrs. Clair McCaskill (Clair McCaskill Letter attached) regarding public official interference with my ongoing Antitrust and Racketeering (Rico) litigation in Kansas City, Missouri District Court case #07-0849-CV-W-FJG. The case involves several public officials including former U.S. Attorney Bradley J. Schlozman. The Senate Judiciary Chairman Mr. Senator Patrick Leahy is also aware of these matters. My concern is that the request made by Mrs. McCaskill was made prior to your confirmation and your encouraging acceptance speech regarding a renewed effort in the rule of law and our constitution. I received confirmation of Senator McCaskill's request from the Office of the Inspector General (Office of the Inspector General letter attached) who then referred my request to the Inspector Division of the FBI (Inspector Division of the FBI letter attached). My request is out of a personal concern for the safety of myself, my family and associates. I know you are extremely busy with the clean up of the previous administration but could you, would you, look into these matters and advise me as a person, a family man, a U.S. Citizen, and my Attorney General what I can do to help resolve these issues. For eight years I have desperately tried to enter the U.S. Healthcare market and provide lower healthcare cost for the citizens of this great country only to be interfered with at every juncture.

This is in response to your letter of March 26, 2007, to U.S. Senator Claire McCaskill, which was forwarded to the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) for review. In your letter you stated that you are being denied entry into the hospital supply market by Novation, LLC, a hospital group purchasing organization. You also indicated that you filed a complaint with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Kansas City, Missouri, in January 2006, and that you did not receive an acknowledgement of your complaint. Additionally, you alleged that you have been targeted by the FBI with warrantless searches and monitoring of your telephone and internet communications.

We have reviewed your complaint and determined that it is more appropriate for review by the FBI, Inspection Division; therefore, we have forwarded your complaint to that office for review and disposition. Dear Mr. Lipari:

We acknowledge receipt of your communication dated March 26, 2007, which was directed to the Office of the Inspector General, Department of Justice (DOJ/OIG), by the Office of Senator Claire McCaskill on December 19, 2008. Your correspondence was forwarded to the Initial Processing Unit (IPU), Internal Investigations Section (IIS), Inspection Division (INSD), Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), for our review. The IPU/IIS is the FBI entity that provides thorough and timely review and investigation into complaints of criminality or serious misconduct against FBI employees.

Your correspondence reflected your claims that the FBI's Kansas City Division failed to investigate your allegations of corruption within the Missouri judicial system. You reported alleged antitrust violations perpetrated by other medical supply companies, including Novation, LLC and Premier, which negatively impacted on your business. You acknowledged initiating civil litigation against these entities and you specifically charged that Kansas District Court Magistrate James P. O'Hara obstructed justice in this matter inasmuch as Judge O'Hara developed private interests in these companies. You alleged the Kansas City Division failed to address your requests for assistance relating to your concerns. You also claimed you became the target of illegal surveillance by the FBI as a result of the allegation you forwarded to the FBI. Your communication also included a request for any records maintained by the FBI relating to you or your company.

IPU has reviewed the circumstances surrounding your complaint and, inasmuch as you did not provide any specific evidence to support your allegations of misconduct by any FBI employee, IPU determined that this matter does not warrant further administrative action. Pursuant to your request for
