ORDER

In light of plaintiffs’ amended complaint, it is hereby


ORDERED that defendant’s motion to dismiss [Dkt. # 9] is DENIED as moot. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that defendant shall file a responsive pleading to the amended complaint by April 22, 2013. If defendant chooses to file another motion to dismiss, defendant can refer to arguments made in the motion to dismiss the original complaint and need not re-brief the counts from the first complaint. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that if defendant files a dispositive motion, plaintiffs must file a response by May 9, 2013, or the Court will grant defendant’s motion as conceded. *See* Local Civil Rule 7(b) (“Within 14 days of the date of service or as such other time as the court may direct, an opposing party shall serve and file a memorandum of points and authorities in opposition to the motion. If such a memorandum is not filed within the prescribed time, the court may treat the motion as conceded.”). And it is

FURTHER ORDERED that defendant's reply to plaintiffs' opposition is due by May 20, 2013.
